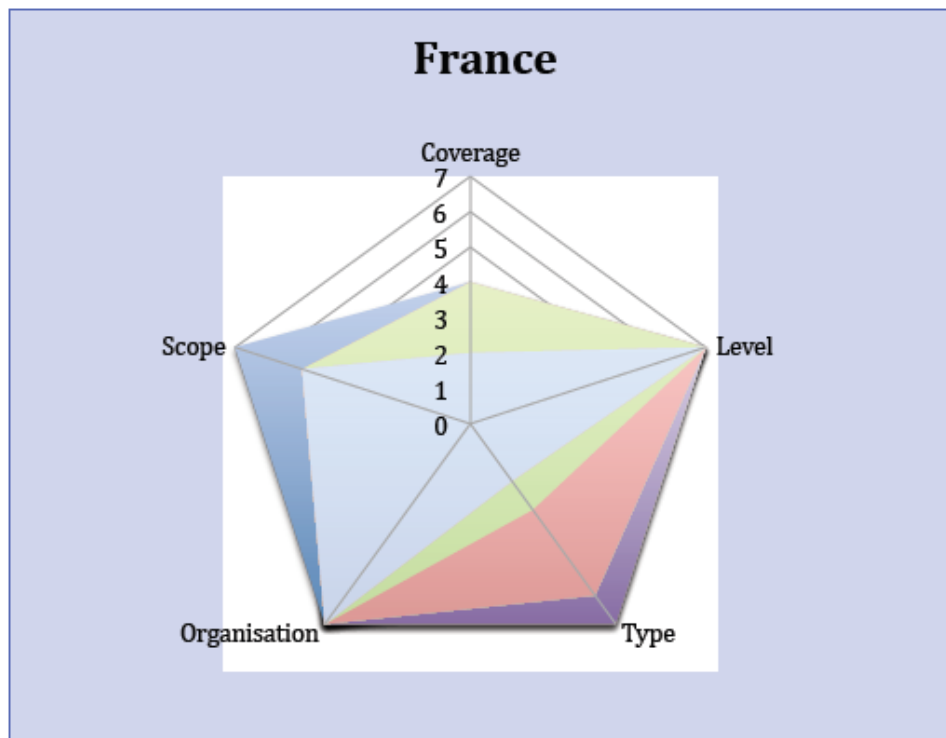

#### 6 – Comments:

France has a national legislation for sporting activities that also applies to the Outdoors. This legislation focuses mainly on issues such as staff training and to a certain extent also to the use of equipment. Within this legislation, there is however no legal obligation for SME's to define a programme safety procedure. The consequence of this situation is the fact that many aspects are not covered or insufficiently covered by legislation.

The drawback of this situation lies in the fact that the French legislation stipulates that it's content 'guarantees the safety of consumers'. French employers therefore tend to consider that once the legislation has been enforced, it is not their responsibility to fill in the remaining gaps.

Due to France's cultural approach of strong legislation, safety gaps (if recognised) are traditionally addressed through National Standards that are perceived as "state" recognised.

Consequently France is in a very ambiguous situation when it comes to implementing safety for outdoor leisure activities.

The overall effectiveness of measures related to safety of outdoor leisure activities in France corresponds to pattern N°3.
